

# MOON RABBIT

## JOE WARRIOR-WALKER

### TEXTE CURATORIAL

Présentée pour la première fois à la SEPTIEME Gallery à Cotonou en janvier 2023, l'exposition personnelle Moon Rabbit de Joe Warrior-Walker arrive à Paris pour une seconde itération. À travers ces œuvres, l'artiste explore la mémoire, le territoire et l'identité culturelle, offrant une réflexion sensible sur notre façon de donner du sens au monde qui nous entoure. Ses abstractions saisissantes tissent un dialogue entre souvenirs personnels et phénomènes universels, invitant le spectateur à se déplacer entre le réel et l'imaginaire.

Les peintures de Joe Warrior-Walker sont la traduction visuelle d'un lieu, d'une mémoire et d'un rapport à l'identité culturelle. Le titre de cette exposition fait référence à une interprétation paréidolique. Il s'agit du phénomène qui consiste à percevoir des images dans des formations nuageuses ou à voir une icône religieuse brûlée dans une tranche de pain grillé. En Occident, un exemple courant de paréidolie est l'homme dans la lune, créé par les marques sombres visibles sur sa face la plus proche. En Asie de l'Est, ces marques sont appelées "lapin de la lune". Nous sommes prédisposés à interpréter l'image et le sens dans l'abstraction, c'est l'une des façons dont nous donnons un sens au monde.

Ces dernières peintures peuvent être interprétées comme des abstractions, mais elles intègrent une attention à la structure du paysage. L'œuvre oscille entre l'ambiguïté et la tangibilité, faisant référence au monde réel sans jamais dépeindre directement un endroit en particulier. Le processus de Warrior-Walker s'inspire de la psychogéographie et répond aux voyages effectués dans son environnement, tout en réimaginant les environnements qui ont façonné son enfance. L'œuvre fait un clin d'œil aux liens de l'artiste avec le Royaume-Uni et l'Inde, embrassant l'histoire des peintures de paysages abstraits de St Ives en Cornouailles, tout en appliquant une palette plus vibrante rappelant les pigments poussiéreux du Kerala.

# TEXT CURATORIAL

First presented at SEPTIEME Gallery in Cotonou in January 2023, this second iteration of Joe Warrior-Walker's solo, Moon Rabbit, continues its journey in Paris. The works delve into the artist's exploration of memory, place, and cultural identity, offering a profound meditation on how we perceive and interpret the world around us. Through vibrant abstractions, Warrior-Walker bridges personal history and collective phenomena, inviting viewers to navigate the spaces between the tangible and the imagined.

Warrior-Walker's paintings imbue a visual translation of place, memory, and a connection to cultural identity. The title of this show refers to a pareidolic interpretation. The phenomena of perceiving images in cloud formations, or seeing a religious icon burnt into a slice of toast. In the West a common example of pareidolia is the Man in the Moon, created by the dark markings visible on its nearest side. In East Asia the markings are referred to as the Moon Rabbit. We are hardwired to Interpret image and meaning into abstraction, it's one way in which we make sense of the world.

These latest paintings can be read as abstractions, however they incorporate an attention to the structure of landscape. The work fluctuates between ambiguity and tangibility, referencing the real world while never directly depicting any one place. Warrior-Walker's process draws from Psychogeography, responding to journeys throughout his surroundings, alongside a reimagining of the environments that shaped his childhood. The work nods to the artists connection to the UK and India, embracing the history of the abstracted landscape paintings of St Ives in Cornwall, whilst applying a more vibrant palette reminiscing the dusty pigments of Kerala.

# BIOGRAPHIE

## JOE WARRIOR-WALKER

Né en 1989, Joe Warrior-Walker a grandi dans la ville balnéaire de St Ives, en Cornouailles. Il a passé une grande partie de son enfance à voyager en Asie avec ses parents. Sa mère d'origine indienne et son père britannique sont tous deux des artistes actifs qui partagent leur temps entre l'Angleterre et l'Inde. En 2011, il s'installe à Londres pour étudier à la Chelsea School of Art. La même année, il est lauréat du Brenda Landon Portrait Prize. Après avoir obtenu son diplôme avec mention très bien, il a reçu une bourse pour effectuer un master à l'UEA de Londres. Après avoir quitté l'école d'art, Warrior-Walker a commencé à exposer dans diverses galeries londoniennes telles que Lacey Contemporary et The Strand Gallery. En 2016, il s'est installé à Bristol où il travaille actuellement dans les BV Studios. Joe Warrior-Walker a beaucoup exposé dans des expositions collectives et a eu plusieurs expositions individuelles. Son travail a été exposé à travers le Royaume-Uni et à l'international.

# BIOGRAPHY

Born 1989, Joe Warrior-Walker grew up in the seaside town of St Ives Cornwall. He spent much of his childhood travelling across Asia with his parents. His Mother of Indian heritage and British father are both working artists who would split their time between England and India. In 2011 he relocated to London to study a degree at The Chelsea School of Art. The same year he was also awarded winner of The Brenda Landon Portrait Prize. After graduating with first class honours he was awarded a scholarship to complete a Masters degree at UEA London. After leaving Art School Warrior-Walker began to exhibit in various London galleries such as Lacey Contemporary and The Strand Gallery. In 2016 he moved to Bristol where he currently works from BV Studios. Joe Warrior-Walker has exhibited extensively in group shows and has had several solo exhibitions. His work has been exhibited across the UK and internationally.
